# Preface

*Falling Unemployment Insurance Protection for Canada's Unemployed* is the Canadian Labour Congress' second comprehensive study of UI/EI coverage. The first, *Left Out In The Cold – the end of UI for Canadian workers*, was published in 1999. This study is part of the work program of the CLC's Social and Economic Policy Department. The analysis was done under the direction of Kevin Hayes, Senior Economist with the Social and Economic Policy Department. Both the unemployment and UI/EI beneficiary statistics for each province, all 58 EI regions, the twenty-four cities, and the 301 federal ridings, by gender and age, was purchased from Statistics Canada. # **SUMMARY**



## Summary

*Falling Unemployment Insurance Protection for Canada's Unemployed* is an analysis by the Canadian Labour Congress of unemployment and Employment Insurance (EI) beneficiary statistics data purchased from Statistics Canada. Maternity, parental, sickness, and Part II employment benefits are **not** included in this analysis.

A key measure of protection is the percentage of unemployed who receive EI unemployment benefits (called "UI" for the purpose of this study). This study details the ratios of UI beneficiaries to the number of unemployed from 1990 to 2001 for Canada, for each province and for twenty-four of Canada's largest cities (census metropolitan areas).

The percentage of unemployed receiving UI is broken down by gender and age. And, for the first time, the coverage ratios by gender and age have been calculated for our largest cities.

The study also details the number of UI beneficiaries for each of the 301 ridings from 1990 to 2001 along with a breakdown of beneficiaries' totals by gender for the years 1997 to 2001. The analysis for the federal ridings contains an estimate of the annual dollar loss for each riding over the 1993 to 2001 period.

## Impact of Higher Eligibility Requirements

Insurance coverage has fallen with each successive increase in the hours and weeks of work needed to qualify and corresponding reductions in maximum benefit weeks.

There were four rounds of changes in the 1990's.

The first two rounds, one at the end of 1990 (Bill C-21), and a second in early 1993 (C-113), reduced protection from 74% of the unemployed in 1990 to 57% in 1993.

The third round came with the 1994 Budget. The legislation cut the length of the benefit period by as much as 50% for many claimants, and laid the base for the benefit structure that would be used for the introduction of Employment Insurance in 1996.

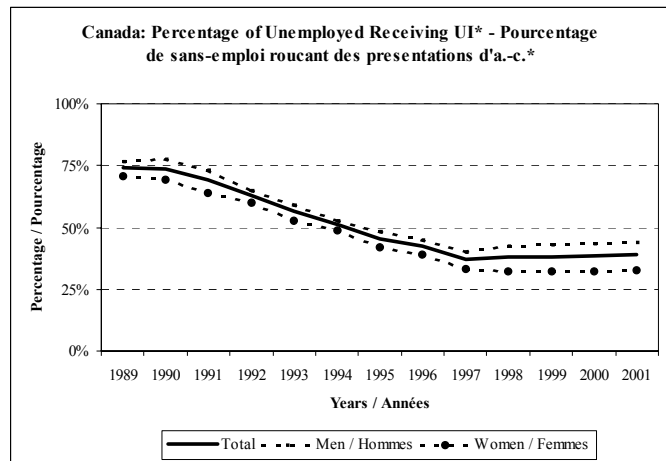
The tougher eligibility rules in the 1994 legislation reduced insurance coverage from 57% of the unemployed in 1993 to 42% in 1996.

The fourth round came with the introduction of Employment Insurance, and the conversion of the “weeks system” as the measure of labour force attachment to an “hours system.” More significantly, EI more than tripled the minimum qualifying hours. It also reduced further the length of the benefit period, and quadrupled the weeks to qualify for thousands of part-time workers.

EI reduced insurance protection to 39% by the end of 2001. Coverage fell further to 38% in 2002.

With both qualifying requirements, and the length of the benefit period determined by a very complex schedule tied to the monthly unemployment rates in 58 different EI regions across the country, coverage ratios vary widely from region to region, province to province, and city to city.

Thirteen of the 24 cities have coverage below 30%. In several cities, less than a quarter of the city's unemployed receive UI.



The differences are more than geographic. The difference in coverage between men and women is large and has widened with the introduction of Employment Insurance in 1996. The gender gap widens even more for specific age groups.

## The Insurance Coverage Gap Between Men and Women Doubles Under EI

EI has had a profoundly negative impact on insurance protection for women of all ages.

In the first five years of EI, from 1996 to 2001, the gap in insurance protection between men and women more than doubled. Coverage for men fell from 45% in 1996 (before EI) to 44% in 2001.

Coverage for women over the same period fell from 39% to 33%.

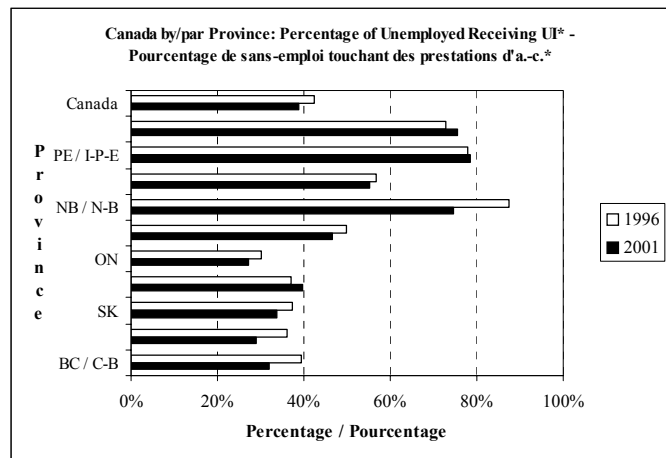

The percentage of women who received UI fell in every province – in several provinces at an even faster rate than it did nationally.

The rate of decline in coverage for men fell at less than a fraction of the rate that it did for women. In four provinces, coverage for men actually increased under EI.

In the 24 cities analysed in this study, women *ARE* worse off under EI rules. The gap in coverage between men and women ballooned in some cities and provinces to a twenty-point difference.



Coverage for women ranges from the highest, at 41% (St. John's), to the lowest, at 16% (Regina).

Almost without exception, where the gender gap narrowed, it was due to coverage for men falling at the same rate as that of women.

## **Gender Gap by Age**

Only 11% of young women, aged 15 to 24, receive EI compared to 20% of young men.

The largest gender gap and the largest number of women affected are in the 25 to 44 age group who are more likely to have young children. In 2001, only 38% of women received benefits compared to 53% for men.

Before EI, there was virtually no difference in coverage between men and women over age 45. Today, only 45% of women receive EI compared to 58% of men.

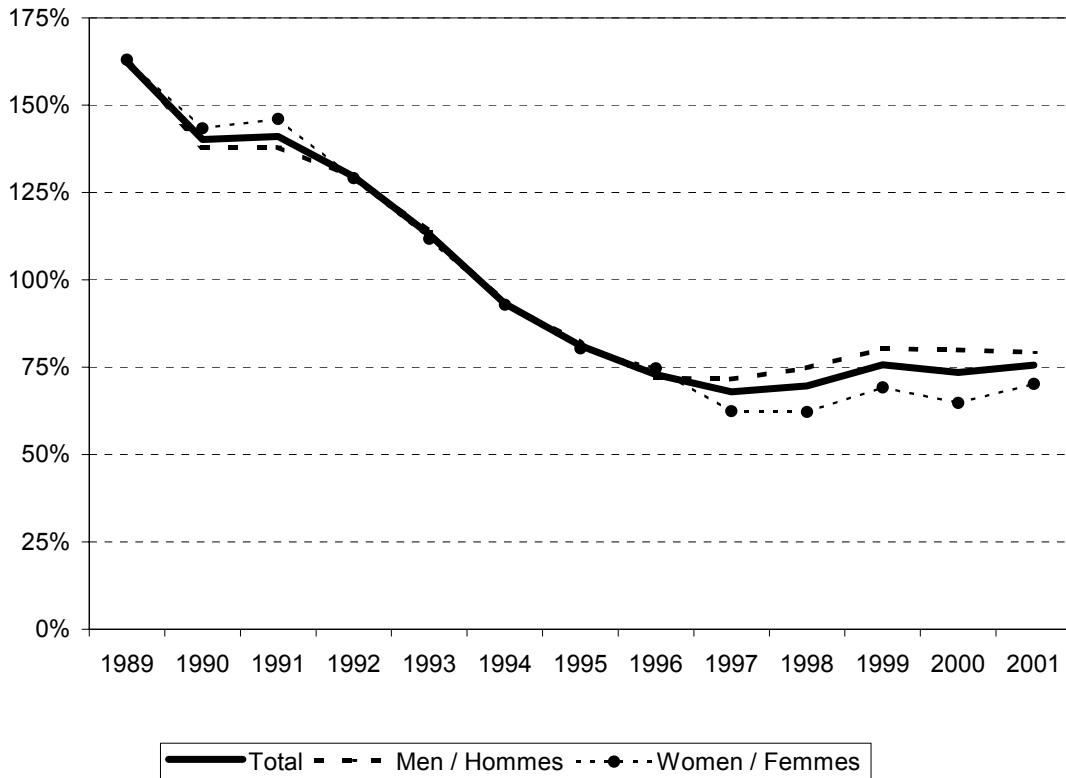

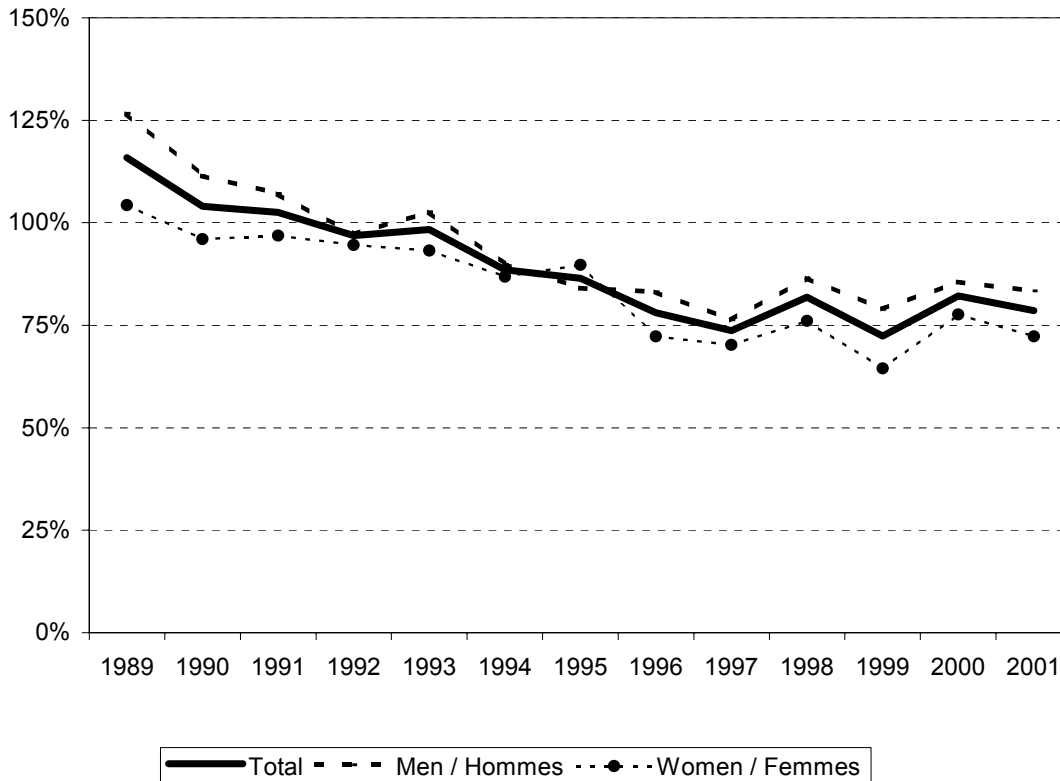

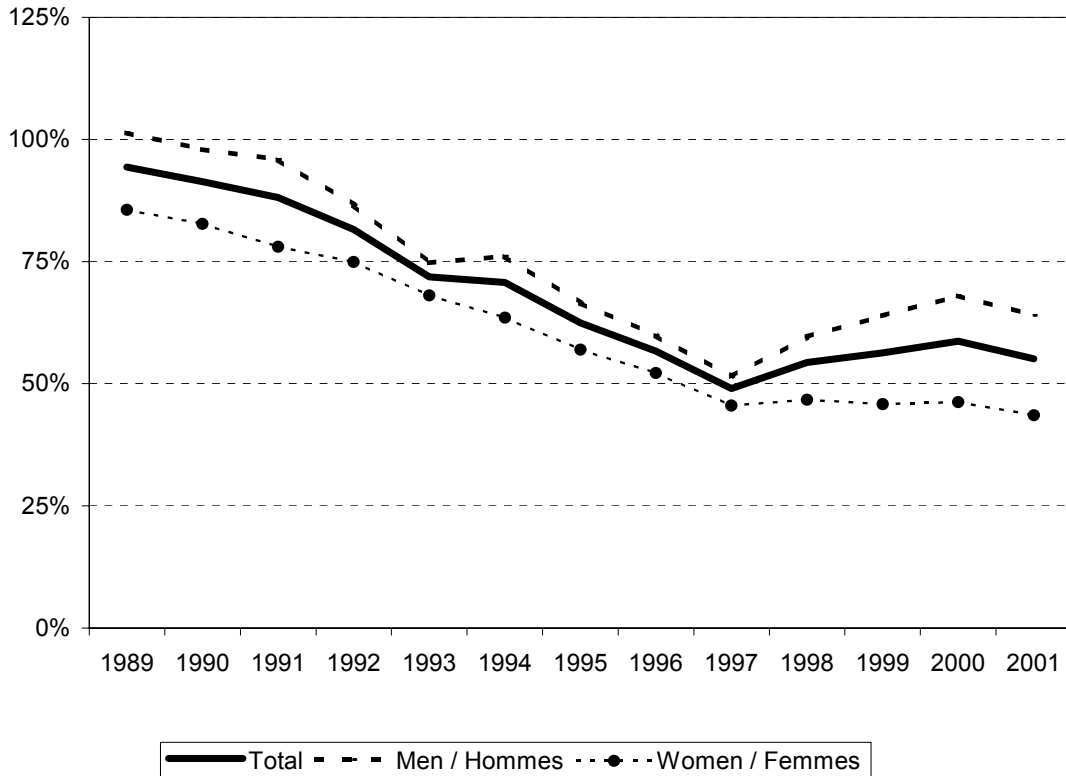

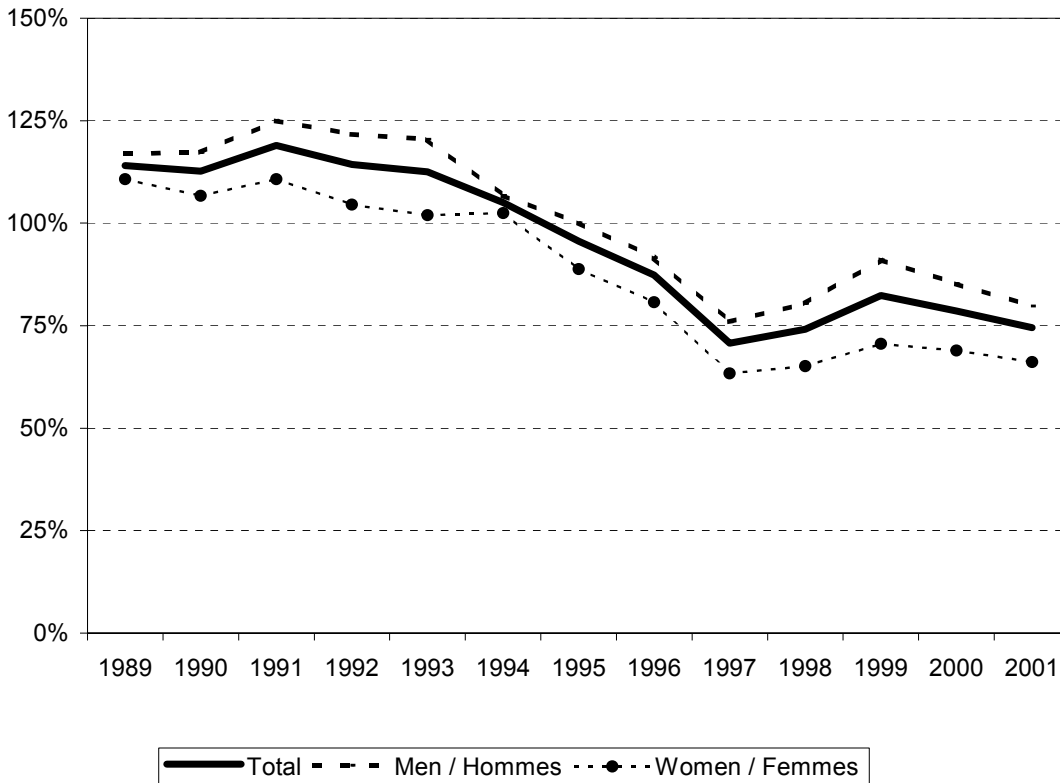

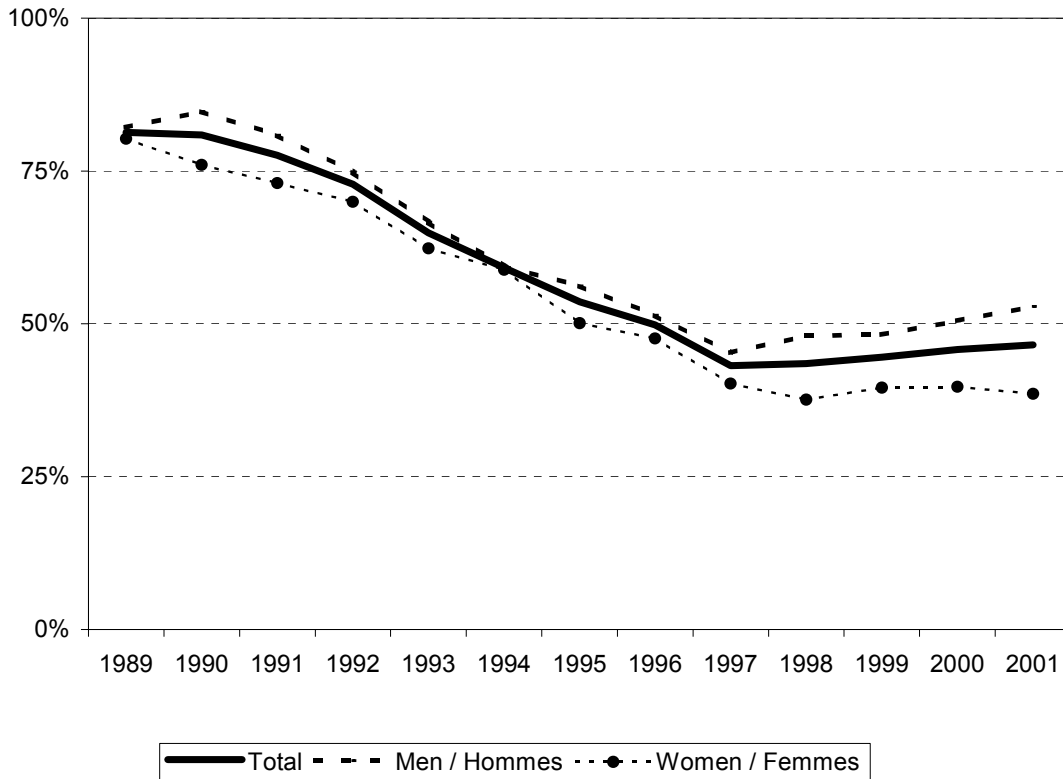

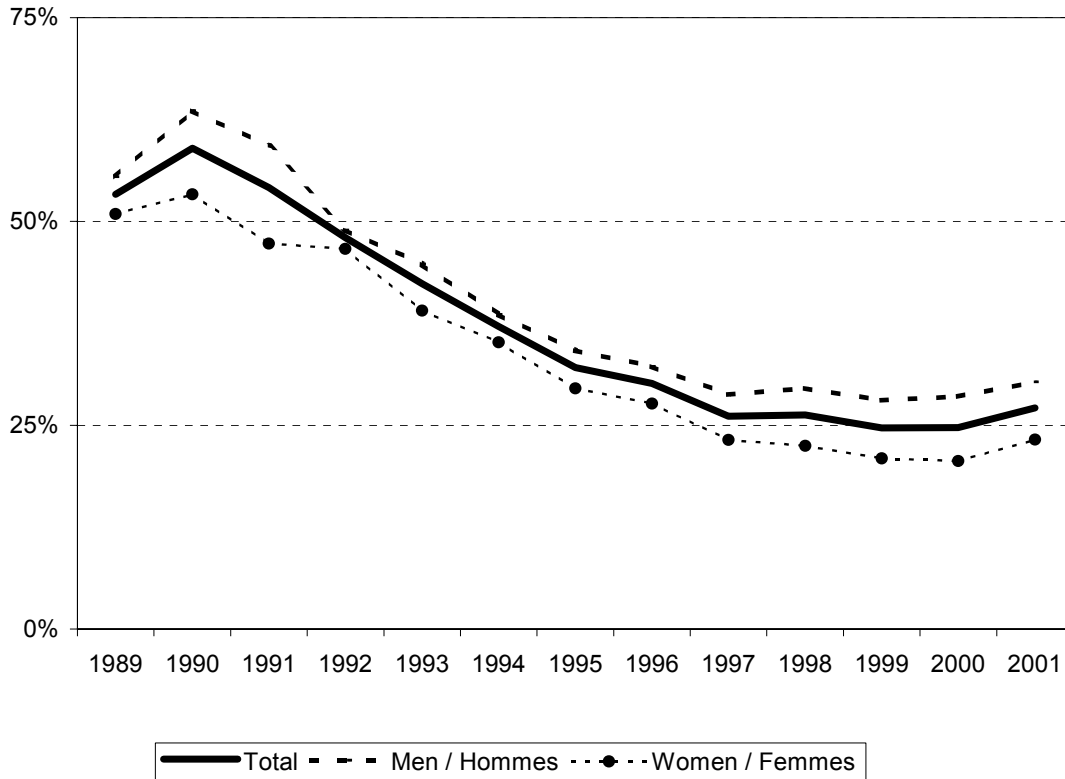

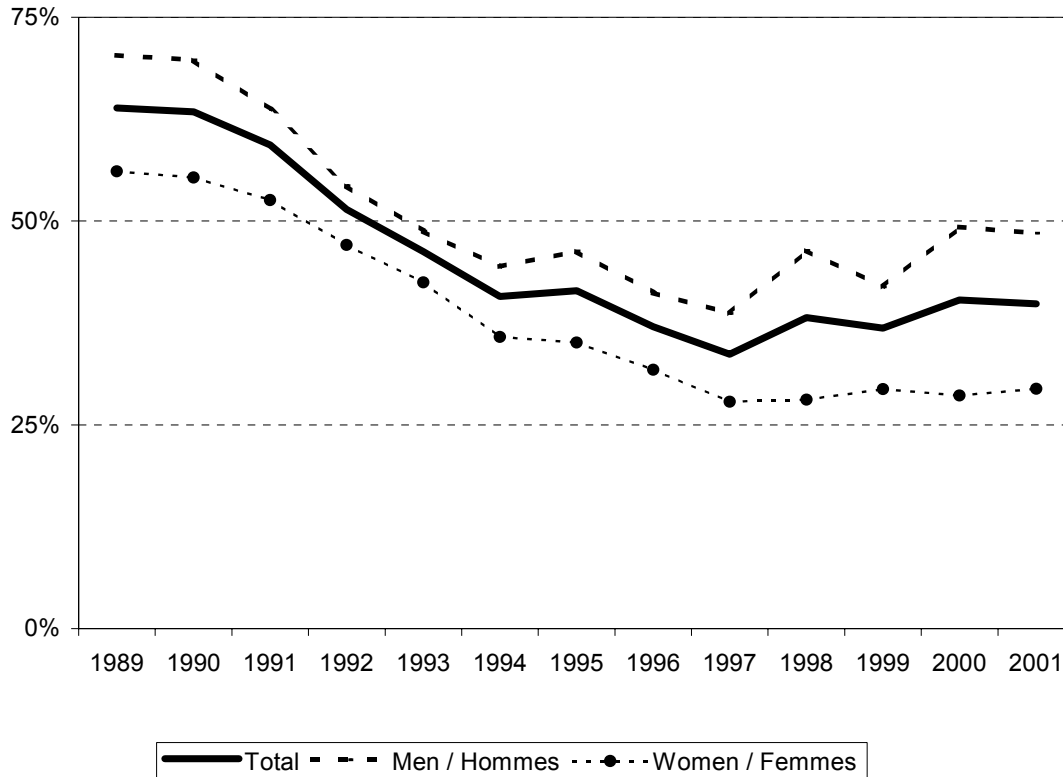

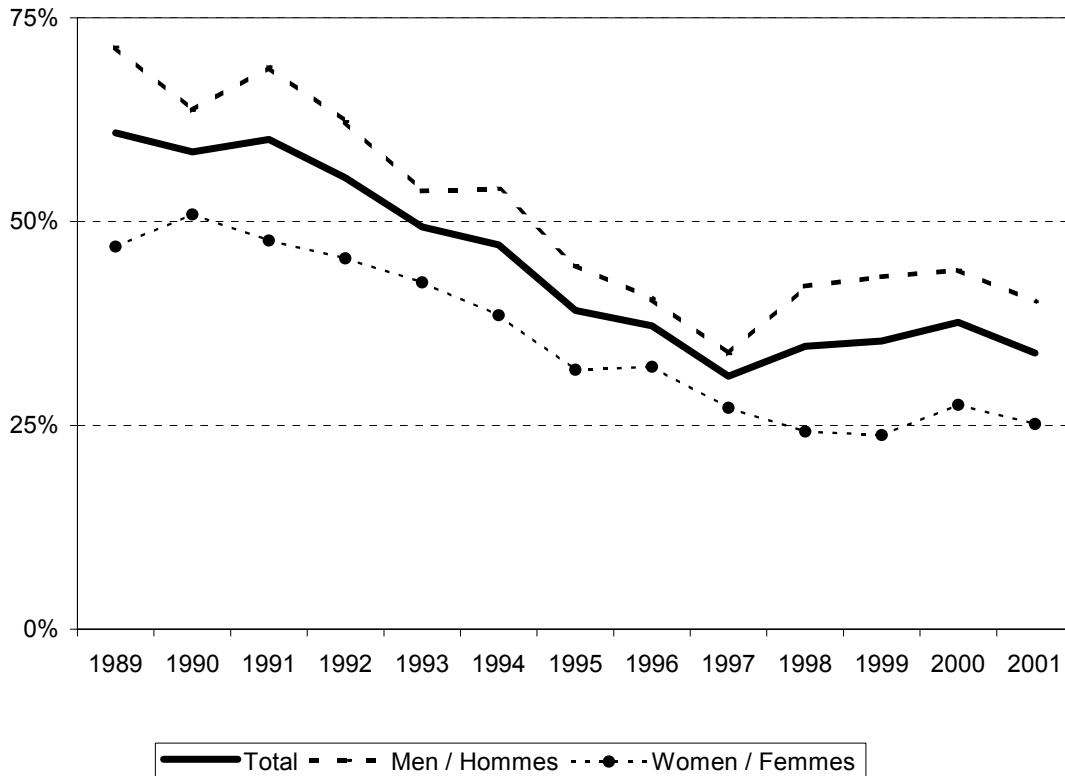

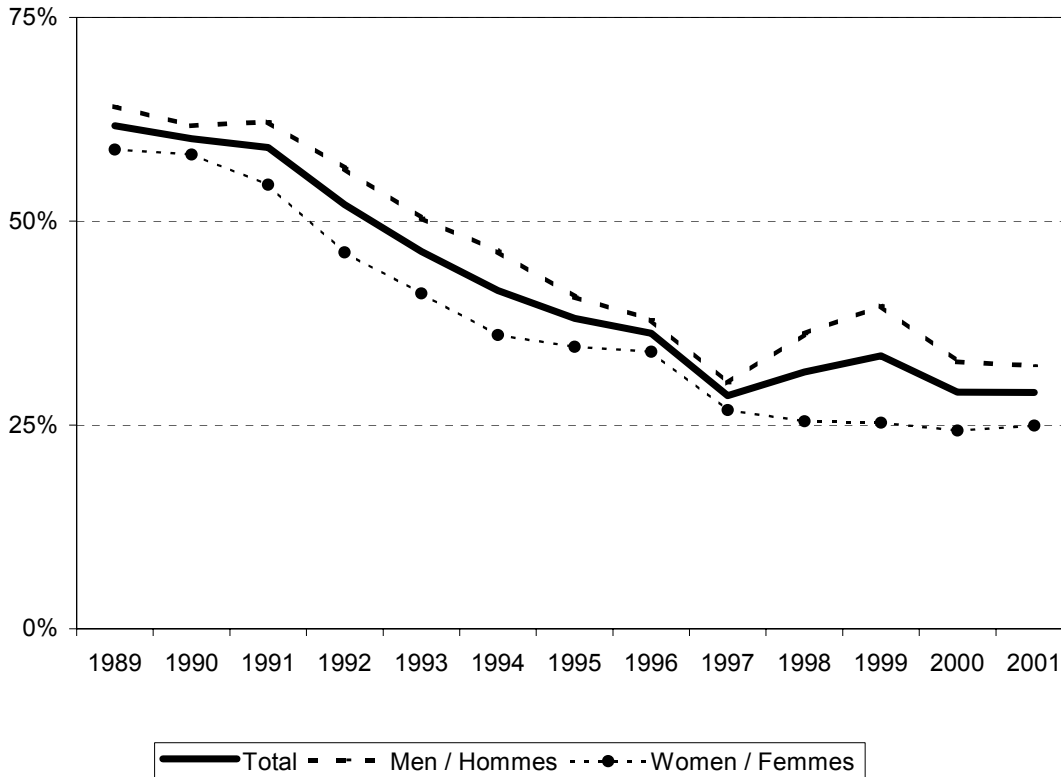
